

Regional Thematic Meeting: Africa Diaspora engagement initiatives on diaspora mentorship

The <u>European Union Global Diaspora Facility</u> (EUDiF) is funded by the European Union (EU) and implemented by the International Centre for Migration Policy Development (ICMPD). EUDiF is the first EU-funded project that works towards fostering an informed, inclusive and impactful diaspora-development ecosystem on a global scale.

In 2020 EUDiF completed a diaspora engagement mapping of 107 countries, exploring policies, practices and trends in diaspora engagement around the world. The table below is a compilation of spotlight initiatives related to diaspora and mentoring in Africa, gathered through our mapping exercise and discussed during the public webinar on 4 May 2021.

Algeria	Support for Rural Women Entrepreneurs in Algeria	The Association Migration Solidarité et Échanges pour le Développement (AMSED) works to improve the economic situation of women in rural communities in Tizi-Ouzou in the Kabylie region of Algeria through diaspora skills transfer to develop agricultural and apiculture skills and provide them with the tools required to develop and maintain their livelihoods. The skills transfer is supported by a series of training activities and mentorship provided by peers based in France. It encourages ecological projects, in particular recycling of clothing and beekeeping, in order to preserve the environment.	
Benin	Support to Beninese diaspora entrepreneurs	The London-based African Foundation for Development (AFFORD) launched its AFFORD Business Centre (ABC) Benin project in February 2020 to enhance the investment potential of the diaspora in the small- and medium-sized enterprise (SME) sector. ABC increases the employability and business skills of Beninese young people and women by providing mentors, business advisory, business development sessions and investment to enable them to create sustainable income opportunities.	https://www.afford-uk.org/abc-be nin/







Côte d'Ivoire	La maison de l' entrepreneur	"La maison de l'entrepreneur" in Ivory Coast is a project led by REDA (Le réseau des entrepreneurs de la diaspora africaine). The project aims to help 7 entrepreneurs with technical assistance and capacity development. As a result of a 3 day training, each participant received a customized work plan to ensure effective work and real results. Ethiopia	Ethiopian Diaspora Fellowship Leadership and Public Service Programme	The Ethiopian Diaspora Fellowship (EDF) program is designed to promote leadership development, public service and creative storytelling. Through training, service in an organization in Ethiopia, peer-to-peer mentorship, and storytelling, fellows will have an opportunity to increase their own cultural identity and be a catalyst for growth and change in Ethiopia. Once in Ethiopia, fellows participate in peer-to-peer mentorship to increase cultural identity and promote a knowledge-sharing opportunity. Libya	Empowering Libyan women in diaspora	In April 2017, the Hague Academy for Local Governance organised a tailor-made training and training of trainers for 17 Libyan women living abroad, financed by the Dutch Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and in cooperation with CILG-VNG International. It aimed to connect Libyan women and support them in developing advocacy strategies to drive change. Nigeria	Beijing +25 (Wiscar)	In partnership with UN Women Nigeria, the Beijing +25 Intergenerational Mentorship Programme is a laudable project strategically designed to provide world-class, structured mentoring, reverse mentoring, cross-learning, collaboration, networking and to facilitate the transfer of institutional memory and requisite leadership skills to a select group of young women activists and advocates by exposing them to a network of formidable and well accomplished older women who are ready to pass on the torch of activism and advocacy and share their wealth of knowledge and experience.
