An introduction to skills auditing



CONTEXT

One of the initial steps in the capacity development journey for diaspora organisations is the need to conduct skills audits to identify existing skills and those needed in the future. Based on EUDiF experience, project development, grant management and fundraising are among the main skills gaps faced by diaspora in delivering and promoting their work. An efficient and streamlined skills auditing process can enable diaspora actors to strategise according to their skills portfolios, explore capacity development opportunities more effectively and boost the impact of their actions.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Participants will learn about how and why to use a skills audit. They will be introduced to a skills auditing tool designed to help further professionalise operations.

During the introductory workshop, the concept and rationale of skills audit will be presented, including a general methodology and evaluation framework. In the second part, the workshop leader will guide participants to test a scalable and modular tool for skills auditing. Feedback from the workshop will be incorporated into the final version of the tool which will be provided to all participants.
